#### From the Rector's desk:

Can you believe that it is nearly the end of 2024! It must be an age thing - when I was a child the time between Guy Fawkes night and Christmas Day seemed interminably long. Now it goes so quickly that I can hardly draw breath as we plunge into Advent - anticipating the birth of Jesus Christ - God as human being. A vulnerable baby born into a time of political unrest to a very young girl, newly married to a carpenter.

We have an amazing list of services that are on offer this December to help us remember and to celebrate this remarkable event, and may I invite you to come along and join us in singing the familiar carols (as well as some popular Christmas songs), to drink mulled wine and to eat mince pies, to share fellowship and friendship with one another, and to pray for our local communities.

We need to pray - these last few weeks have been quite challenging with our Archbishop resigning after the Makin report was published. Bishop Martin wrote to all clergy in our diocese very soon after the resignation, and in his letter, he wrote:

"...Our first concern, support and prayers must now and always be for the victims of this and all abuse. It will be hard for most to imagine the effect of the horrors perpetrated on so many by Smyth, and then the compounded suffering of not being heard. Please hold all victims in your prayers.'

I agree wholeheartedly with this statement, and may I assure you that we work hard in this benefice to ensure that our churches are safe places for everyone. I am very grateful to the Churchwardens, PCC members, Ministry Team and others who undergo mandatory training and uphold the Church of England's Safeguarding Standards, and I am very grateful to our Benefice Safeguarding Officer, Andy Price, for all he does in facilitating training and in supporting me. If you have any questions on safeguarding in your local situation, then please do not hesitate to get in touch.

Your local church is there for YOU - and it is always great to see the building used outside Sunday morning worship. We recently held a craft fair at Cockfield St Peter's, and it was great to see the space being used for a community event. 

### Big Green Challenge for December

Climate change presents significant challenges to agriculture in the Sub-Saharan African region and across Africa generally. Smallholder farmers are adopting various

adaptation strategies to mitigate the impacts of climate change. Rainfed agricultural areas, which account for approximately 95% of the region's food production, are particularly vulnerable to droughts and unpredictable rainfall patterns. Therefore, it is crucial to transform the African agricultural sector, which is largely dominated by smallholder farmers, to better withstand the challenges posed by climate change. The problem is that rainfall has become increasingly unreliable and so rainy seasons sometimes come early, or late, or not at all. In 2018 in Kagera, Tanzania, the big rainy season came early and so farmers planted their crops. Then the rains stopped after about a week and everything dried up. This meant that many went hungry as they had used their seeds to no effect. Farmers are also finding that their crops are more susceptible to pests and diseases because of the warmer weather. These affect yields and can have devastating effects on

farmers' incomes and their ability to feed their families. As global temperatures rise, and rainfall becomes more unpredictable there needs to be more done to mitigate the effects of these changes. We can help:

- CCMP (Church and Community Mobilisation Process) in Kagera, our link diocese, is working with local farmers to mitigate the effects of climate change. New water tanks, foot pumps and tree planting make a real difference to farmers' livelihoods.
- Christian Aid is working with farmers in Ethiopia and elsewhere to put in pipelines from springs and storage tanks with pumps to ensure a year-round water supply.
- Other aid agencies are responding to droughts by bringing in emergency aid when it is needed.

This Christmas could you give a gift to an agency or to Kagera (gift form on the diocesan website) to ensure more families have enough to eat this coming year? In 2025 could your church hold a climate crisis service and donate money to one of the above to enable mitigations to take place in rural parishes in Africa?

In many of our churches, where the weekly service may be some form of the Eucharist, the Old Testament nowadays is never read. And even where it is, it is often ignored. But it is the larger part of the Bible and has far more to say than the New Testament about things like the life cycle (birth, marriage, death), sickness and health, daily work, the environment, social justice, and so on. In other words, it relates to life as we know it on a day-by-day basis. Of course, there are some challenging bits which need also to be confronted in an honest manner, but they should not deflect us from the riches of what was, after all, Jesus' Bible. (Where did he get the first and great commandment ... and the second is like, namely this...?) In this short course, Hugh Williamson will try to open our eyes to some of this wealth by surveying in an engaging manner all the different types of material in the Old Testament, very much with an eye on how we can apply it in our own times in both church and society.
